# What's new by version

### Version 6.5

NOTE: Aurora Playout 6.5 now requires you to license the XMOS and SDB Servers. This is a new SabreTooth license that is available using the instructions found in the Licensing Section of this document (page 11).

- MediaFrame in the Assignment List Plug-in A MediaFrame tab has been added to the ALP in order to allow search, preview, and highlight capabilities.
- **Preview Finished Stories in ALP, Playlist, and ALM** The Assignment List Plug-in, Aurora Playout Playlis, and Assignment List Manager all have the ability to preview lo-resolution assets that have been published as finished stories through the news workflow.

**Note** – The preferred workflow for viewing finished stories in the applications mentioned above is to send to two send destinations; one to the playout server and one to a local publish folder within the news database. The publish folder should then be configured as a monitored folder for scavenging low-resolution assets within the MediaFrame configuration tool. The published sequence will then associate the timeline, the placeholder, and the low-resolution media in a reliable way for MediaFrame previews.

• MediaFrame in Housekeeper – MediaFrame in Housekeeper allows users to search a K2 MDI, preview assets, and drag and drop assets to empty placeholders within the clip import tab.

**Note** – For MediaFrame connectivity to function between the ALP, Housekeeper, and the Aurora Playout applications that are on a different domain than the MediaFrame server, there must be a defined one-way trust relationship between these systems and the MediaFrame Server.

- **System Information Utility** The Help->About box now includes a System Information Utility.
- **Recue Option Change** There is now an option to prevent auto recue above the last played item in the rundown.
- Cue All with X-Keys X-Keys configuration now has an option to set Cue All to a button on the panel.
- **Prevent Cue All from Ejecting Playing Items** The Cue and Chain tab of Tools/ Options now allows users to prevent cue all from ejecting playing items.
- **Delete Button in ALP and ALM** Users can now delete placeholders from the ALP and ALM.
- Assign Stories to Channels not in Rotation Users can now assign stories to channels that are not included in the regular channel rotation, even from NRCS.

### Version 6.3

- **Temporary 30-day Demo License** Aurora Playout provides a 30-day demo license for a smooth transition in your broadcast operation.
- Support for Profile XP Media Platform Aurora Playout is qualified for use with Profile XP Media Platform, in addition to the existing support for K2 platform and M-Series iVDR.
- **Placeholder Quick Search** You can get to a specific placeholder by entering first few characters from the name of the placeholder. This feature is supported in Clip Browser of the Aurora Playout application, Assignment List Manager, Assignment List Plug-in and Housekeeper.
- **Turn Off MOS Status Update** An option to turn off MOS status update, in order to avoid status reporting conflicts to NCS from primary and backup systems. When you have both systems running, it is advisable to uncheck the box for Update MOS status on the backup system.
- **Increase of Channeless Connection Limit** The increase applies to K2 version 3.2 only. With the new limit, up to eight channeless connections to a single K2 client (such as from the Housekeeper application) can run simultaneously.
- **GPI Output Trigger by End Blip** GPI output can be triggered automatically by the channel End Blips. For chained clips, the GPI trigger applies only to the last clip in the chain.
- Editorial Duration Priority Once the editorial duration is set for a placeholder, it will not be automatically changed to media duration as part of the send for playback.

### Version 6.1

• **Support for 720p** - Aurora Playout supports high definition (HD) format for 720 lines of progressive scan or better known as 720p.

### Version 6.0b

• **Support for M-Series iVDR** - Aurora Playout is qualified for use with M-Series iVDR, in addition to the existing support for K2 platform.

### Version 6.0

- Archive Play Deck Control Archive Play can be configured to remotely start and stop recording to a deck through RS-422 control.
- Automatically Exit Archive Play When Archive Play finishes, the application automatically returns to normal playback mode.
- **Disable GPI Input in Archive Play** An option has been added to disable GPI inputs while in Archive Play mode.
- Ethernet Channel Control As an alternative to RS-422 control, playback channels can be configured to connect via Ethernet.
- **Rundown Calendar (ENPS only)** When connected to ENPS, a rundown calendar allows filtering the rundown list by a specific date.

- **Run Time Counter** For logging purposes, a Run Time counter can be started to record a Hit Time for each story. In Archive Play mode, this counter also displays the Total Run Time for the opened rundown(s).
- **Distinct Play/Stop GPI Triggers** Play and Stop GPI commands can be assigned to separate triggers, rather than having a combined Play/Stop toggle.
- **Connection Status Lights** Status indicator lights have been added to allow a quick visual verification that components are connected.
- **Prevent Pause after Play** A configurable option allows you to prevent an accidental Stop command within a few seconds of hitting Play.
- Flashing Sync Indicator The Sync button now flashes when sync has been broken between Playout and the Newsroom Computer System.
- **Configuration Summary Pages** For GPI, Channel, and Function Key configuration, a Summary page allows you to see all settings in one table.
- **Improved Buddy Server Support** When connected to an ENPS buddy server, the application will automatically switch back to the primary ENPS server when it becomes available.
- **16:9 Thumbnails** An option allows the use of either 4:3 or 16:9 aspect ratio for thumbnails.
- Automatic Server Reconnect After a media server is temporarily offline (such as during a reboot), SDB Server and Housekeeper will reconnect to it once it's available, without user intervention.
- Housekeeper Direct Delete In Housekeeper, you can optionally delete clips and placeholders directly, bypassing the Recycle Bin.
- Assignment List Rundown View In the Assignment List Plug-in, a tree view allows the sorting of items by rundown.
- **Break Indicator** A special "Break" placeholder can be inserted into a rundown so that breaks are visible in the Playout playlist.
- **Channel-specific X-keys** When using the X-keys Jog/Shuttle controller, the ability to assign channel-specific commands has been added.

### **Fixes included in version 6.5**

- (89901) Selecting "Block primary access" on ENPS main server doesn't cause XMOS to failover to ENPS buddy server.
- (90279) iNews Integration: Changing channel assignment results in blank MOS status.
- (88375) Placeholder duration is updated multiple times if there are multiple Playout servers during Auto Transfer.
- (90894) Run Time counter can only display minutes and seconds, not hours.
- (91301) Playout crashes when floating/unfloating a story during auto recue..
- (91609) Need to invoke vbrRegAccess.exe during installer to avoid filling Thomson Event Viewer with permission errors.

- (58925) XMOS can take a long time to synchronize after it has regained connection to NCS.
- (84718) After wiping database and using Repopulate Rundown Items, ENPS autocreate no longer works.

# **Installing Aurora Playout**

NOTE: Aurora Playout 6.5 now requires you to license the XMOS and SDB Servers. This is a new SabreTooth license that is available using the instructions found in the Licensing Section of this document (page 11).

The various Aurora Playout components reside on multiple computers. The following table indicates where each component is typically installed

Component	Machine where you install it
Aurora Playout application	Aurora Playout computer
	NOTE: It is recommended that Aurora Playout is run at a display resolution of 1280 x 1024.
Thumbnail Server	Separate PC for the Server Components.
	NOTE: You do not need to install Thumbnail Server if you are using M-Series iVDR or K2 as your Media Server.
Aurora Playout Server Components: XMOS Server	Recommend installing on a separate computer, but may be installed on Aurora Playout computer.
SDB Server	NOTE: When the XMOS Server application is running on a Windows XP system, it is recommended that the "Windows Firewall" feature be turned off, as it can adversely affect the speed of MOS communication with the newsroom computer system.
Housekeeper	Aurora Playout computer or another PC on the same network.
Assignment List Manager (standalone version)	Non-NCS computers, usually used by Newsroom Producers.
Assignment List Plug-in	All NCS client computers. See Aurora Playout User Guide for installation instructions.
Hot Standby Database Server	Optional; install on a PC on the same network as the Aurora Playout computer.


NOTE: The Thumbnail Server is not needed for non-Profile installations.

Because you must configure some components with the locations of other components, you should plan your overall installation before you begin.

To install the Aurora Playout application and its components:

- 1. Insert the Aurora Playout CD into the CD-ROM drive.
- 2. Navigate to the CD and double-click SetupAuroraPlayout.exe.

3. Click Next until you reach the Select Components screen.



- 4. At the Select Components screen, check the boxes for the component(s) that you want to install.
- 5. Click Next to start the installation.
- 6. Click Finish at the Installation Complete screen.
- 7. Configure each component by following instructions in the Aurora Playout User Guide.

### **Using a Configuration File**

If you want to install the Assignment List Plug-in on multiple computers with the same configuration, you can create a network installer:

- 1. Copy the Aurora Playout software installation file, **SetupAuroraPlayout.exe**, from the CD onto your network.
- 2. Using a text editor such as Notepad, create a file called **setup.ini** similar to this example:



Name	Description
DatabaseServer	The name of the server hosting the Aurora Playout database (primary SDB Server).
BackupDatabaseServer	The name of the server hosting the hot standby Aurora Playout database (backup SDB Server).
MOSID	Your MOS ID.
Thumbnail Path	The full path to the shared thumbnail directory on the computer where thumbnails are stored, in the format <b>\\server\foldername</b> ; e.g., if you have a shared folder named "thumbnails" on your playout system named "Playout1", the path would be <b>\\Playout1\thumbnails</b> . This path needs to match the path set in Aurora Edit— <b>Tools</b>   <b>Options   Aurora Playout   Thumbnails Path</b> .
VideoStandard	Your video standard: <b>0</b> for PAL, <b>1</b> for NTSC - Drop Frame, or <b>2</b> for NTSC - Non-drop Frame.
XMOS Server	The name of the computer hosting the XMOS Server.
Rundown View	Determines whether to show the list of rundowns in the left pane of the Assignment List Plug-in: <b>0</b> for off, <b>1</b> for on.
UnicodeDragDrop	Your Newsroom Computer System: <b>0</b> for iNEWS or <b>1</b> for ENPS/ Octopus.

3. Save the file in the directory with the **SetupAuroraPlayout.exe** file.

From each computer on which you are installing the plug-in:

- 1. Navigate to the network directory where you saved the installer and configuration file and double-click **SetupAuroraPlayout.exe**.
- 2. Click Next until you reach the Select Components screen.
- 3. At the Select Components screen, check the Assignment List Plugin checkbox and click Next.



4. Select Configure Assignment List Plugin using setup.ini and click Next.

5. Click **Finish** to complete the installation.

The installer uses the setup.ini file to configure the Assignment List Plug-in.

#### Using a Batch File

You can also create a batch file to automatically install the Assignment List Plug-in using the setup.ini file.

To create the batch file:

- 1. Create a text file named **setupALP.bat**.
- 2. In the file, put this text:

setupauroraplayout.exe /ALP

3. Save the file into the same directory as the Aurora Playout installer and your setup.ini file.

From each computer on which you are installing the plug-in:

• Double-click setupALP.bat.

The batch file runs and installs the plug-in.

### **Upgrade Instructions**

When upgrading from one version of Aurora Playout to another, you should close the current Aurora Playout application.

It is not mandatory, but it is advisable that you uninstall Aurora Playout's components before installing the new version. Reboot your machine after the installation is complete.

# **Licensing Aurora Playout**

NOTE: Aurora Playout 6.5 now requires you to license the XMOS and SDB Servers. This is a new SabreTooth license that is available using the instructions below.

Once you have installed Aurora Playout, you are provided with a 30-day demo license. You need to get a license number from Grass Valley in order to install the permanent license. Obtaining the software license number is important because you cannot launch channels or configure Aurora Playout after your 30-day demo license has expired.

1. Select Start | Programs | Grass Valley | Aurora | License Request.

The Aurora License wizard begins.

- 2. Fill out the License Request for your system.
- 3. Send the request to the email address stated in the License Request wizard.

You will be provided with a software license number from Thomson Grass Valley.

### **Known issues**

The following limitations are present in this Aurora Playout Software 6.5 release. If you wish to obtain more information about these limitations, please mention the reference numbers that follow the description of each limitation.

Description	If Aurora Playout doesn't play all the way through your playlist when using the Archive Play feature, there may be a problem with the black clip that is used as filler between clips. (42885)
Workaround	Make sure that you have a clip called "BLACK" (all uppercase) in the same bin on the Media Server where you send stories for playout (normally the "default" bin). One way to create this clip is to insert 10 seconds of filler into an otherwise empty Aurora Edit sequence and send it to the playout bin.
Description	When working with iNEWS rundowns, the Rundown Bar window in Aurora Playout will always display "NOT READY" in the Status column. (34585)
Workaround	This column is designed to work with the "MOS Ready to air" property that is available with ENPS rundowns. Since this feature is not applicable with iNEWS rundowns, you may wish to resize the Status column to its minimum size when connected to an iNEWS system.
Description	When media is sent to a placeholder that is embedded in an iNEWS story, the Clip Duration column in the iNEWS client will not update. (44677)
Workaround	The duration will update if the media is first sent to the placeholder and then added to the iNEWS story.

#### Known issues

Description	The connection between iNEWS rundowns is lost and then re-established (such as by rebooting the iNEWS server). (35882)
Workaround	Re-monitor your rundowns through iNEWS before they will be available in Aurora Playout's dropdown list.
Description	Trimming a clip in an Aurora Playout channel will not affect the duration that displays on a Newsroom Computer System, such as ENPS. (63446)
Workaround	None.
Description	In ENPS client, the Actual column couldn't be updated with the Editorial Duration set for the Aurora Playout placeholder. (44269)
Workaround	In the ENPS client, the script window for a story must be closed before the Actual column will be updated with the Editorial Duration set for the Aurora Playout placeholder.
Description	When connected to a Newsroom Computer System, channel assignment or status changes that were made through the Aurora Playout interface will be reset if the item's rundown position is changed on the NCS. (35932)
Workaround	This is by design. If you wish to keep manual channel assignments when reordering items, you can assign channels through the NCS, rather than through Aurora Playout.
Description	Status translation table in mosconfig.xml on the iNEWS MOS Gateway system did not operate correctly with Aurora Playout. (69097)
Workaround	iNEWS users may need to make the following changes to the status translation table in mosconfig.xml on the iNEWS MOS Gateway system in order to make statuses operate correctly with Aurora Playout:
	1. Change <statuscued>CUED</statuscued> to <statuscued>STAND BY</statuscued> .
	2. Change <statusstopped>PLAYED</statusstopped> to <statusstopped>END</statusstopped> .
Description	Differences in MOS status reporting could lead to Octopus not operating correctly with Aurora Playout. (49674)
Workaround	Octopus users need to make these following changes to the Statuses tab within Admin   MOS   Devices of the Octopus application:
	1. Change <b>CUED</b> status to <b>STAND BY</b> .
	2. Change <b>PLAYED</b> status to <b>END</b> .

Description	With iNEWS, misconfigured settings can cause stories to drop to the bottom of the playlist when they are newly inserted, or when their channel assignment is changed. (75836)
Workaround	This problem can occur when the mosconfig.xml on the iNEWS gateway has "handlesRoItemLevel" set to "YES". Ensure that the line in the mosconfig.xml is set as follows: <handlesroitemlevelcommands>NO<handlesroitemlevelcommands></handlesroitemlevelcommands></handlesroitemlevelcommands>
Description	A K2 version 3.2 playout system supports a maximum of only four channeless AMP connections at one time (this is separate from the channeled connections that are used for playback). (68152)
Workaround	So, for example, only one SDB Server connection and three Housekeeper connections to a K2 can be configured at a time.
Description	Problems with updating the Ready status of clips. (68611)
Workaround	More than one Aurora Playout system should not be configured to connect to the same channel on a K2 as this can cause problems with updating the Ready status of clips.
Description	Uninstalling Thomson Event Viewer does not remove its shortcut icon from desktop and Start Program Menu. (77446)
Workaround	No workaround is available at this time. However, selecting Aurora Playout either from Aurora 6.1 or Aurora 6.3 in the Start Program Menu will open the same latest version of the application.
Description	Republication of sequence, master clip, or subclip causes metadata associations to break. (99292)
Workaround	Before resending, if the previously published version of the item is deleted from the publish folder, then the resend will preserve association. To delete the previously published item, you can use Aurora Edit or Aurora Browse; for Aurora Browse, the most precise deletion is to list the associated assets for the logical asset, then delete only the asset (a sequence, for example) that is in the Aurora Edit publish folder.
Description	There is no Clear Points function in the MediaFrame Clip Viewer of ALP and Playlist. (91630)
Workaround	To reset trimmed clips back to the original mark in and mark out, you must manually move the new mark in and out back to their original positions and reset the mark points individually.

Description	Clear trim points no longer functional in MediaFrame Clip Viewer of ALP and Playlist. (91630)
Workaround	To reset trimmed clips back to the original mark in and mark out, you must manually move the new mark in and out back to their original positions and reset the mark points individually.
